

TURNER WILL BE THE CANDIDATE

King, Whitman, Spokane, Pierce and Clarke Counties Agree Upon a Slate In the Washington State Democratic Convention.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Bellingham, Wash., Aug. 2.—This is the ticket agreed upon by a combination of King, Pierce, Spokane, Whitman and Clarke counties at noon today:
Governor—George Turner of Spokane.
Lieutenant-Governor—Stephen Judson of Pierce.
Supreme Judge—Alfred Battle of King.
Treasurer—George Mudgett of Spokane.
Secretary of State—Peter Hough of Clarke.
Auditor—Lee R. Purdin of Kittitas.
Land Commissioner—Van R. Pierson of King.
Attorney-General—C. H. Neal of Lincoln.
Superintendent of Schools—W. D. Gerard of King.
Congressmen—J. J. Anderson of Pierce, B. H. Silver of Whitman and Frank Garrick of Walla Walla.
But one presidential elector, John Trumbull of Chlallam, was elected. The conference really represented greater strength than is indicated by the list of counties. It controls the convention and will put through the ticket agreed upon.
The settlement of the fight for lieutenant-governor is the result of a duke Judson was in the Pierce county delegates, who fought Ernest Lester, and at heart favored the nomination of Henry Drum of Olympia, and rather than take an outside man to beat Lester at Sunday's caucus at Tacoma, the Pierce county men supported Judson.
The lister following turned about and forced Judson to the front at Bellingham. A. R. Thlow, George B. Wright, Ernest Lester and E. J. Walsh, all Pierce county men, really forced Judson onto the convention and prevented the Drum men from dropping him.
Judson is a pioneer, having been a resident at Steilacoom before the fort was built there. In fact, he hauled lumber for the historic fort. He is a well known former state senator, sheriff and treasurer of Pierce county, and is a brother of John Paul Judson, city attorney of Spokane.
The state convention convened at 2 o'clock today. The state committees named State Senator Will G. Graves of Spokane for temporary chairman, O. J. Ernest of Tacoma as secretary, and Frank Reeves of Wenatchee as assistant secretary. In a speech before the convention Graves arraigned Roosevelt as the representative of the "mailed fist" and not a typical American, and he lauded Parker. Speaking of state issues, Graves said that the fight was between the people and the corporations, political in name only. Tremendous enthusiasm prevailed. Maurice Langhorne of Lewis county will be permanent chairman and an effort will be made to complete the work today.

LINE TO CONDON IS ANNOUNCED

MANAGER CALVIN SAYS A WHEAT COUNTRY OF GREAT FERTILITY WILL BE TAPPED—PROMOTERS OF ANOTHER LINE SAY THEY WILL ALSO BUILD.

General Manager E. E. Calvin of the Oregon Railroad & Navigation company has announced the intention of his company to construct a railroad between Arlington and Condon, a distance of between 55 and 60 miles, that will tap one of the most fertile wheat belts in the state. The announcement was made on the return of Mr. Calvin and other O. R. & N. officials from a trip of inspection of the country to be penetrated by the proposed road.
The proposed construction of the road follows closely upon the plans of the Arlington & Pacific Coast railway to construct a similar road. The Arlington & Pacific Coast officials declare that they have secured an exclusive right of way through the territory, and that it is doubtful if the O. R. & N. company's plans will materialize.
According to the announcement of Mr. Calvin, the O. R. & N. company seeks to enable the farmers in Gilliam county to market their produce with greater facility. At present wagons are the only carriers of produce.
The exact route to be followed by the proposed line has not been decided upon in certain places where, it is said, the right of way has not been secured. It is stated positively, however, that Arlington and Condon will be the terminal points of the road. Three routes are under consideration by the O. R. & N. officials, according to Mr. Calvin, pending the final result in securing the rights of way.
"The O. R. & N. company has no power, under its charter, to build branch lines," said Mr. Calvin, "but a company will be organized to construct the road. It has been decided to begin active construction work as soon as the route has been completely laid out."
Officials of the Arlington & Pacific Coast company declare that they have not abandoned their plan to construct a road between the same towns as those which the O. R. & N. will reach.
"Our company was formed for the purpose of building a road between those two points and eventually extending it," said an official of the Arlington & Pacific Coast company. "We have already secured our right of way for such purposes and we can have no trouble in that direction. We have recently been very active in our plans, and the O. R. & N.'s announcement is not worrying us."

PLAYFUL WHALE ENDANGERS BOATS

Seattle, Aug. 2.—Navigation of small boats on Elliott bay in front of Seattle is dangerous for a big whale is swimming around in the sound and makes its appearance in most unexpected places. RUSSIAN ROBBERY

WHEELS BUT \$1000

(Journal Special Service.)
Chicago, Aug. 2.—Following a new plan of robbery, four masked men last night held up the Pullman only on the Illinois Central Diamond special and secured for their pains money and property aggregating a little less than \$1,000 in worth. With a remarkable efficiency they followed the robbery by today exposing themselves to suspicion and capture in Griffith, Ind., where they endeavored to dispose of a diamond to a local saloon-keeper, called for papers containing an account of the robbery and laughed as they read the stories.
After a time that the "Diamond special" left Chicago at 9:27 o'clock last night, bound for St. Louis, carrying many passengers who were on their way to visit the world's fair, the train was within a few miles of Matteson, four men, two of whom were masked and heavily armed, entered the forward sleeping-car, awoke the slumbering passengers and ordered them all into the smoking compartment of the Pullman. The passengers in this car were then ordered to join their fellow-travelers that had been brought back from the forward car.
The passengers from the first car had been ordered to bring along their clothing, and the occupants of both cars, after being lined up in the rear Pullman, were relieved of their cash and valuables by one of the men, who was apparently the leader of the gang, while two of his comrades kept guard, one at each end of the car.
The leader searched every piece of clothing carefully, and after satisfying himself that he had secured everything of value from the pockets of the wearing apparel, made a thorough search of the nightclothes worn by the passengers for anything of value that they might have concealed.
During these proceedings one of the band had stood guard in the vestibule of the train, and after the three inside the car had completed their work they joined the outside guard after having locked the doors of the car, pulled the bell rope, and as the train came to a stop, escaped in the darkness.
So quietly were the proceedings carried out by the bandits that the train crew had not the slightest inkling that anything out of the ordinary was taking place, and not until the engineer, who upon bringing the train to a stop and getting a response from the train crew, left his engine and went back to the rear of the train, was the discovery made that a robbery had been committed.
The mail and express car was not molested, and the women passengers, who had retired for the night, and across whose berths curtains were drawn, were not interfered with.
Only three shots were fired, and this was fired into a berth to hurt the occupants along. A boy was also struck by a hatchet in the hands of one of the bandits and severely injured. After the mail and express car was secured with alacrity to the commands of the leader and the entire performance occupied only a short time.
As soon as the train reached Kankakee the robbery was reported to the officials and a special train was sent from Chicago to take up the trail of the robbers.
When the train arrived at St. Louis this morning a complete inventory was made by the passengers of their losses, which total less than \$1,000.

JOHN HALL WILL BE REAPPOINTED

OREGON DELEGATION WILL MEET NEXT MONDAY TO CONFER UPON FEDERAL PATRONAGE AND WILL RECOMMEND UNITED STATES DISTRICT ATTORNEY.

It can be stated authoritatively that John Hall will be reappointed United States district attorney. From time to time rumors have been current that some one else was to get the job, and the Oregon delegation has been credited with a reluctance to recommend him for another term. Nevertheless Hall is to get a reappointment and the matter will be virtually settled next Monday, when the delegation is to meet in this city.
As a matter of fact it has been certain for several months past that this would be the outcome. The department of justice is strongly desirous that he should continue in office, for the reason that several of the land fraud cases, as well as the material, the Oregon Surveyor General Meldrum, will come on for trial next winter, and Hall's thorough familiarity with all of these cases renders it almost imperative that he shall conduct them. Hall's term expires on September 1, but he has been reappointed many months ago but the question of a reappointment was deferred in order to allow the Oregon delegation to agree, if possible, upon some recommendation, either of Hall or of some other candidate.
There were difficulties in the way of such an agreement. Pulton was originally committed to the support of George Brownell, but he, because of the appointment, became a candidate for the Republican nomination for state district attorney, he virtually abandoned his chance of succeeding John Hall. His chances were lessened still further by the local campaign which followed, for Moreland was freely accused of knifing both Sanderson Reed and Jim Stott, nominees on the regular party ticket. If he should now be recommended for United States district attorney there would be a howl of protest from the Republican machine, and Senator Mitchell is keenly alive to this fact.
Senator Mitchell probably considers that he is involved by Moreland's course from further active effort to convey the latter appointed United States district attorney. He stands by his pledge, however, and to all inquiries for publication he replies that Moreland is still his candidate. No one imagines, however, that the senator has the slightest expectation of securing Moreland's appointment.
When it has been sufficiently demonstrated that the senator has kept his pledge and that Moreland cannot obtain the support of a majority of the delegation, it is expected that both Mitchell and Williamson will give their support to John Hall. There is reason to believe that both Senator Pulton and Congressman Hermann are also prepared to support Hall, so that his reappointment may now be regarded as assured.

CHAFFEE INSPECTS WALLA WALLA TROOPS
