ST. HELENS FIRE BURNS A SECTION

BLAZE STARTS BACK OF TOWN AND
100 ACRES ARE LEFT BURNED
AND FLAMES STILL ARE UNSUB-
DIED—PROPERTY OF THE ONE-
GOD WOOD COMPANY.

A fire started in the timber back of St. Helens and Houlton yesterday afternoon and destroyed a lot of cordwood belonging to the Oregon Wood Company, and is said to be burning through a lot of green timber. The fire started in the vicinity of the Webber tract, and the entire 100 acres was burned over, including the fallen timber, as well as the green growth of standing trees. There were no buildings on the tract. The fire is reported to be under considerable head, and may do further damage before it is checked.

The fire, that started from the slashings on the Yikstrom place back of St. Helens, is still burning slowly in places, but it is not believed that any further damage will result. In addition to the fence burnings reported yesterday, the plank enclosures along one side of the Old Forest road, between the rail-road track and part of the fence, were one and was burned. The cemetery is the property of the St. Helens Odd Fellows Lodge, and is about three and a half miles this side of that place, along the Northern Pacific railroad track.

In spite of the patrol and constant vigilance the Cascade forest reserves has not escaped a share of fires. Adolf Ahonen, supervisor of the north division of the Cascade forest reserve, passed through the city last night on his way to his official headquarters on Hood river. He had been on a tour of inspection through the reserve, and reported that there had been several fires in the vicinity of the headwaters of the Clackamas river. However, no damage resulted, as the bushes ran over ground covered with dead logs, brush, and dry vegetation, and was used in guarding against forest fires in the reserve, and a close watch is kept over persons camping in the woods to see that no camp fires are left burning. The entire reserve is patrolled by experienced men who have their regular beats. An extra force is employed during the extreme dry season.
