WEATHER REPORT.
Weather conditions and general forecast for Oregon, Washington and Idaho. Heavy rains are expected in southeastern Minnesota, the excessive amount of 2.30 inches being reported from St. Paul during the last 24 hours. Light rains have fallen near the immediate coast in the south Atlantic and the Gulf states and also in New Mexico. In the Pacific states the weather continues with temperatures generally about 5 degrees above normal. Along the immediate coast, however, from Durak to Cape Elizabeth, the weather is foggy.

Forest Grove, Washington county, S. F. Walker—Hot and dry, cool nights; harvest completed; everything needs rain; estimates on hops vary; quality good; apples will be small, but large yield; potatoes and pastures need rain badly; one thing has been shown, and that is the benefit of thorough irrigation and culture to offset dry weather.
Liberty, Marion county, T. C. Davidson—Weather warm and very dry; threshing all done; yield light, quality fair; spring oats turned out poor; hop-picking has commenced in a few yards; next week it will be general; quality good, yield medium.
