HOO HOOS TO HOWL HERE IN PORTLAND

DELEGATES FROM THROUGHOUT THE SUPREME NINE OF THE CONFEDERATED ORDER OF THE HOO HOO, WHICH MEETS AT ST. LOUIS SEPTEMBER 9, TO HAVE PORTLAND SELECTED AS THE NEXT ANNUAL MEETING PLACE OF THE ORDER.

Every possible influence will be brought to bear at the annual meeting of the Supreme Nine of the Confederated Order of the Hoo Hoo, which meets at St. Louis September 9, to have Portland selected as the next annual meeting place of the order.

Two delegates have been sent to St. Louis to urge the selection of Portland. They are George E. Youle, Pacific coast representative of the S. A. Woods Manufacturing company of Boston, Mass., and F. J. Durham, traveling representative for E. C. Atkins & Co.

Portland will probably be represented on the Supreme Nine also. It was requested formerly by Robert D. Inman and is now represented by James A. Clock of the Wisconsin Central railway.

A strong letter from the Hoo Hoo of Washington and a telegram from the annual meeting in Seattle will be read before the Supreme Nine at exactly 9 o'clock in the evening of September 9, nine being the mystic number of the Hoo Hoo, urging that Portland be the next meeting place of the order.

NEWS OF THE MINES

PERMANENT WORK AT WALDO SMELTER

EVERYTHING WAS COMPLETED BY THE MANAGEMENT OF THE TAKILMA SMELTER FOR BLASTING IN THE PERMANENT RUN EARLY THIS WEEK. NO NEWS HAS BEEN RECEIVED YET WHETHER THE PLANT IS OPERATING, BUT IT IS PRESUMED TO BE SO.

Blowing in of the Takilma smelter is the most important mining development of southern Oregon for many years. Mr. Tut and associates are the men owning the United States Reduction & Refining company properties of Colorado, which is the second largest reduction concern of the world.

One of the company properties is to be handled at the commencement of the week. The Queen of Bronze and Cowboy mines leading at present in production.

NEW MILL WILL BE UP AT EARLY DATE

THE NEW MILL EQUIPMENT TO BE OPERATED THIS FALL—ONE IS FOUND IN LARGE QUANTITIES—SITING IN CANTON FOR SEVERAL MONTHS.

Work is being done by the management of the Great Northern mine in the Blue river district to give the Huntington grinder and additional concentrating plant installed before the bad weather sets in.

The incorporation of the company managing the Great Northern with W. E. Standish of Brownsville and H. C. Nelson and A. O. Waller at the helm, places it in condition for more effective operations.

On the lower level of the Standard mine, in the Quartzburg district, an ore body recently entered has been found to have a length of more than 50 feet. Vice-President Zoeth Houser came to the city yesterday and stated when asked by the Journal that the ore body passed beyond this point, but another that had been opened above was due.

BUNKER HILL PEOPLE PAY BIG DIVIDEND

Wardner, Ida., Sept. 8.—The September dividend of the Bunker Hill & Sullivan mining company, aggregating \$1,000,000, was declared yesterday. This disbursement will bring the total dividends of the big Coeur d'Alene concern since January 1, 1924, up to \$12,000,000.
