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FOR LAYING MINES IN PUGET SOUND

QUARTERMASTER GRANT ASKS FOR BIDS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF BOATS TO BE USED IN THE PEACING OF SUBMARINE DEFENSE IN THE NORTHWEST.

(Special Dispatch to the Journal.) Seattle, Wash., Sept. 7.—Acting under directions received from Washington, D. C., Quartermaster Grant yesterday inserted an advertisement for bids for the construction of 15 boats to be used in laying mines about the coast of Puget Sound.

In army circles the utmost reticence is maintained regarding the purpose of the vessels and the nature of the inquiries are made by showing the specifications, which do not indicate other than that the boats are for laying mines.

The announcement of the government is to have the boats on Puget sound ready to lay mines about the various forts at moment's notice. In this way in the event of war being declared against the United States the government is protecting the north coast fortifications and make the entrance of a hostile fleet into the waters of Puget sound an impossibility.

Particularly was the question applied to the straits. It is hinted that such might be the case, the location being such as to cause no hazard to shipping. The officers refuse to answer any questions, saying that it is against the rules of the government to give out any such information.

KEEPER ELOPES WITH A HELPLESS CRIPPLE
