550,000,000 BUSHEL CROP IS EXPECTED

OLD OPTION GAINS WHILE MAY IS DOWN

Chicago, Sept. 9.—The government grain report will be issued at 4 p. m., Washington time, Saturday, September 10. It will give the condition of spring wheat in the north and west and the time of the harvest and also the condition of corn. It is said the report will show a wheat crop of 540,000,000 to 550,000,000 bushels last month. The condition of corn last month was 7.5 per cent and the crop 1,407,000 bushels. It is said the condition will be close to 80 per cent. Last year it was 30.1 per cent. The condition of oats a month ago was 85.5 per cent, suggesting a crop of 750,000,000 bushels.
