BRITISH SHIP'S TRIP

eighth day a slight wind came up and the vessel finally succeeded in reaching the bax.

Captain Griffith reports that he encountered a number of other calms on the passage from Newcasile-on-Tyne, and that he was bothered with but very little rough weather. He states that he was caught in a 10 days' calm between the Falkland and Staten islands. While rounding the Horn there was no wind to speak of, but the seas were far from amooth. But nothing of incident occurred. Coming up the Pacific coast the usual horthwest blows had to be contanded with and the passage was necessarily slow. The quator on this side was crossed 160 days out, and a month later Point Conception was sighted. Port Los Angeles was reached after a passage of 135 days, where 2,000 tons of the vessel's cargo was discharged.

It required 28 days to make the voyage from the California city to the mouth of the Columbia river, but a good portion of this time the ship was held in the calm. Had she been favored with wind, the captain states that the trip would have been completed in very creditable time.

While at Los Angeles 10 of the saliors deserted, and their places were filed with new men to make the run to Portland. Many of them were inexperienced seamen, and it is supposed that they will walk ashore as soon as the vessel docka. She is now anchored out in the stream below the Albina ferry, waiting for a berth to be provided for her at the Greenwich dock, where the remainder of her cargo will be discharged. It is consigned to Girvin & Expe. and comprises 1,100 tons of pig-iron, firebrick and coke. The ship was not chartered for the outward passage.
