

MASS MEETING ON BRIDGE QUESTION

Residents Living Near Sullivan's Gulch Will Gather to Discuss Means of Relief—People Undecided Between Wood and Iron Bridges.

Spanning Sullivan's gulch, that forms a dividing ravine through the greater part of the east side, are two dilapidated bridges, one of which is closed to all but street car traffic and the other gives promise also of soon being too dangerous for use.

As a result of the delay of the council, caused partly by the dimensions of the residents of that section, constant protests are made by business men and other residents who are affected by the want of a bridge on Union avenue.

People who live in the vicinity are caused all kinds of inconvenience and annoyance. Those living north of East Gilsan street who desire to come down town, may do so by going only a few blocks out of the way.

Half a mile may be saved if the trip is made across the Twelfth street bridge, teams taking that route being forced to go only a mile out of the way.

Though only two short blocks intervene it is a great deal cheaper to live on East Union avenue or Gylran street than it is on East Gilsan.
