(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Salem, Oct. 7.—Jacob Siegfried was yesterday adjudged insane and ordered committed to the Oregon hospital for the insane. He is suffering from religious mania.

Siegfried owns a farm of 130 acres near Silverton, of which about 20 acres is set in hops. He is single and aged 35 years.

An order was made by the court requiring Siegfried to pay to the state \$10 a month for his maintenance while confined in the asylum. This is the first case for some time where this provision of the law was brought into force.
