



The interest of the United States in an isthmian canal was not essentially different from that of other maritime nations down to the middle of the 18th century, but it assumed great strength when California was acquired, and it has steadily grown as the importance of the PACIFIC STATES HAS DEVELOPED. In 1848, and again in 1854, treaties were negotiated with Nicaragua authorizing the United States to build the cunal, but in netter case was the treaty ratified. 
