## BUILDING BOOM REACHES ASTORIA

### NEW HOSPITAL TO BE BUILT BY SISTERS OF ST. MARY—PROPOSAL ALSO UNDER CONSIDERATION FOR BUILDING OF NEW SCHOOL COURTYARD PROGRAMMING.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Astoria, Or., Oct. 11.—The Sisters of St. Mary's hospital have announced that a new modern hospital will be erected in Astoria. Work will begin in the spring, and by January 1, 1907, it is expected that the building will be in operation. The present institution has accommodations for 50 patients, while the new will be able to care for 100. It will cost \$75,000 to \$100,000, be of four stories and built of stone and brick. The public will be asked to assist financially. The sisters believe many outside patients will come to the new hospital on account of the unsurpassed and healthful climate.

A proposal is also under way for the erection of a new hotel. The company is to be organized shortly. It is proposed to put up a five-story building, about \$100,000. The company in charge will be made up of local capitalists.

### Work on Court House.

Work on Clatsop county's new \$150,000 court house is progressing favorably and the basement is nearly finished. This structure will be two stories in height, but the basement will be above the level of the street, giving the building a three-story appearance. It will be one of the finest public buildings in the state, with ample vault room.

The new city hall is also well along. This structure is to cost \$150,000. It will be located at Sixteenth and Exchange streets and will fill the present needs of the municipality.

### Big Building Boom.

Astorian business experienced so extensive a building boom as is or at present. Scores of new structures are being put up all over the city, and scores of others will be erected as soon as carpenters can be found to do the work.

Manager Hedrick's theatre has been striving to have his playhouse enlarged, but has been unable to secure carpenters here or at Portland. Despite the building boom, which has been on for nearly a year, there is constantly increasing clamor for more homes. Astoria's population has increased 25 per cent in the last year, and trade conditions were never before so gratifying.

It is confidently expected the state census will give the city a population of nearly 20,000. The remarkable growth is attributed to development of local industries.
