DOUGLAS MINE HAS STARTS TWO MILLS IN PRESENT WEEK

RAINBOW, A NEW COPPER PROPOSITION, IS OFFERED BY MORE THAN 5,000 FEET OF WORK—DEPTH OF 600 FEET ATTAINED BY ADITS.

Manager O. C. Wright of the Black Butte, Blue Bird and Buck Horn companies of eastern Oregon passed through the city late yesterday on his way to the former Willamette valley home, where he and his wife will visit a week.

At the Blue Bird only 10 stamps have been put in commission, as work has been centered upon this addition to the mill to handle the ore. The stamps have been put in the former concentrating building, and embrace portions of the former plant, stamps alone having been added.

Mr. Wright says that the total development now completed on the Rainbow aggregate more than 5,000 feet. This work has been concentrated on one location, and on a plan of permanent open-pit shafts.

A force of eight men was engaged upon improving the shaft. They were in the lower level, where the vein is widening materially. The face of this drift gives backs of approximately 1,000 feet, and as the drift extends into the hill, it increases rapidly.

The Rainbaw has essentially a copper ore, gold values being present in most copper ore. The vein is about 100 feet thick, and is very rich.

PORTLAND ADMITS THE ORE. The finest carload of ore ever put on exhibit in this city was that of the Oregon King, which went through the city late last month.
