MORE SHARES SOLD THAN FOR THREE YEARS

New York, Oct. 19.—Profit taking seemed to be the chief factor in the market today and prices ruled somewhat lower all through the list. Sales were very heavy all day amounting to a total of nearly 2,000,000 shares, which is the highest point reached since 1901. There were no special features. Fluctuations were slight. The closing was weak at nearly the low mark.

CATTLEMEN RAID BIG SHEEP CAMPS
Choyenna, Wyo., Oct. 19.—Sheep and cattle men clashed at Grays River, near Wind River forest reserve a few days ago, and nearly a thousand sheep were driven over a cliff by the cattle men and killed.
The sheep had trespassed upon the forest reserve and had been driven off by rangers only to return again. This time the rangers drove the sheep into the cattle country. The cattle men gathered and after running the herd out of the country destroyed the sheep wagons and camps and slaughtered the sheep. The herdsmen were not injured. The raid was the culmination of a controversy between the sheep and cattle interests which had been of long standing.
