

PITCHER THIELMAN IS IN TROUBLE

**WARRANT ISSUED FOR ARREST OF
PORTLAND'S STAR TWIRLER—
CONDUCTOR CLAIMS MAN OF
CURVES ASSAULTED HIM LAST
NIGHT.**

A warrant was issued at the municipal court late this afternoon for the arrest of Jake Thielman, one of the pitchers of the Portland Browns. It charges assault and battery. G. Evans, a conductor on the Washington street trolley of the Portland Railway Company, was the complainant. The arrest will probably be made this afternoon, as the warrant was placed in the hands of the police to serve.

Manager Butler had a consultation with Thielman early this morning concerning the matter, advising him to have the matter settled out of court, if possible. Otherwise, he said, the club is apt to find the pitcher \$1,000 and he would have to pay the results of the meeting before Municipal Judge Hodge. However, the matter came to an issue this afternoon, when Municipal Court Clerk Fred Olson sent the warrant to Captain Gritzmacher for service.

Conductor Evans' story is to the effect that Thielman boarded his car at Thirteenth and Washington streets last night about 11 o'clock and wanted to ride, but had no transportation left. He was told he could not ride unless he paid. He could not pay, he said, and was made to leave the car.

After a short auto trip, Thielman, it is said, again boarded Evans' car. This was at Twenty-fourth and Thurman streets. Thielman is said to have been drunk. He removed his overcoat, asked the conductor what he meant by putting him off the car previously, and then delivered his victim three staggering blows, felling him to the floor of the car.

Thielman admitted to Manager Butler that he struck the conductor, but did not give his reasons.

WOMAN'S EVIDENCE LACKS CONTINUITY

Placed on the witness stand this morning in the hearing of her suit for the nullification of her marriage ceremony with John E. Trigg, and to recover \$1,000 for services as housekeeper and \$5,000 damages, Emma C. Talbert was confronted with a number of affidavits proving discrepancies in certain parts of her testimony.

Attorney J. F. Booths, representing Trigg, a heavy-bearded man, 60 years of age, forced Mrs. Talbert to admit that she was engaged to Trigg when she sued John A. Talbert for a divorce. This was shown to disprove her contention that she was persuaded by the defendant to violate the law. She was divorced from Talbert June 9, 1900, and went to Vancouver, Wash., and married Trigg October 20 of the same year, less than six months afterward. The hearing is in progress before a jury in Circuit Judge Frantz's court.

U. S. AUTHORITIES TO PROSECUTE MADOLE

FOUNDED UNCONSCIOUS.

He is still unconscious and nothing is known of him here. He has been rooming in the second story of the building in front of where he was found and it is believed he was either thrown out of the window or fell out. The name is taken from a draft found in his pocket. It is believed by the attending physician he will die.
