TRIES TO QUOTE PARKER'S CHARGES AT THE TIME

REPLY OF GOVERNOR WRIGHT OF THE PHILIPPINES TO SECRETARY OF WAR TAIT SHOWS THAT CHARGES REFERRED TO BY TAIT ARE UNWARRANTED.

Washington, Oct. 24.—The war department has made public a letter which was passed between Governor Wright of the Philippines and Secretary of War Tait, that were occasioned by the public address delivered by Judge Parker on October 15.

"October 20, 1904. To Mr. Wright, Manila. The Democratic candidate for president, on the 15th of the present month, in a public address said:

"But two classes of our people can hope to be benefited by our holding the Philippines—the class which is always hunting for special government privileges, and the class which seeks to make of office-holding a means of livelihood.

"The situation in the Philippines today is so terrible that it passes the comprehension of our people at home. Agriculturally, the country is for the time ruined. Land is uncultivated; the population is ill fed, and in some places unable to get work.

"Your comment as civil governor upon this statement of conditions in the islands is requested by the secretary of war.

"The reply of Governor Wright, which was received at the war department yesterday afternoon is in substance as follows:

"First.—The statement that any considerable number of officials have proved corrupt, inefficient or despotic does great injustice to a body of hard-working, self-respecting Americans.

"Third.—Taxation is not oppressive. Customs duties average about 15 per cent on value, and the Spanish regime, 25 per cent under the Spanish regime.

"Fourth.—There have been occasional instances during the last year of deprivations of rights, which find concealment in the remote mountains, but which are being removed by aid generously extended by congress.
