CANNOT CONTROL THE ACTION OF BOARD

John Manley Charged with Taking Weapons Away from Special Policeman.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)

Salem, Or., Nov. 17.—In case the legislature passes an act appropriating money from the general fund to the common school fund, to liquidate the mortgage of \$1,806 held by the state land board against the fair grounds the state fair will run next year just as usual, only with even brighter prospects for a great exposition, and possibly one of two weeks duration. The usual privilege of selling liquor, and the pool privilege at the grand stand, will be sold by the state board of agriculture, and unless something unforseen occurs the fact that prohibition was passed by a popular vote in Chemawa precinct, in which the fair grounds are situated, will have no effect.

Ford goes further and says that no special law, passed by the legislature, can be superseded by a general law, enacted by that body, or by the people of any precinct. It would thus be necessary for the legislature to directly repeal the act of 1961, granting special privileges to the board, if liquor is not to be sold on the state fair grounds.

President Downing and the other members of the board are jubilant over the new turn of affairs, as it will insure an income of practically \$2,000 a year, which would otherwise be lost. Since the discussion has arose, many people have expressed themselves as being opposed to the sale of liquor in the grounds, and say they believe the seneral public would prefer to have the legislature appropriate \$2,000 extra to fill the deficiency, but until this is done the board does not feel like waiving the privilege unless compelled to.

H. Penland. It is said that Penland was knocked down by Manley, who relieved the officer of his billy and revolver and delivered them to Chief of Police Gibson.


