As a result Chief Hunt cautioned every patrolman on the morning shift to keep a keen watch for dogs whose actions were of a character to excite suspicion.

George McGowan, manager of the Ames Mercantile Agency, while riding his wheel at Fourth and Montgomery streets yesterday morning, was attacked by a big yellow dog.

The incident was reported to the police by Mr. McGowan. He said he did not care to cause the owner of the brute any trouble, but desired that when it is allowed to roam at large hereafter it be muzzled, a patrolman, upon making an investigation, ascertained that the dog is the property of people living at 325 Fourth street.

Complaint was made to Captain Grimsbach yesterday that a mad dog had pursued children and one or two adults on East Ninth street, and that two of these had narrowly escaped its fangs.

Patrolman Crata located the animal at 174 East Ninth street and killed it.

Two or three large dogs owned by a stockman, named Plummer, have recently been the cause of trouble in Albina. Their barking, it is said, has not only disturbed the neighborhood at night, but they have shown their teeth originally threateningly at passers-by.
