MINE INSPECTOR NOT WANTED BY OPERATORS

Eddy Law to Be Opposed Where Affecting Mining-New President Chosen.

Establishment of a state geological bureau was championed last evening at the meeting of the executive committee of the Oregon Miners' association. A committee will formulate a bill and submit it to the legislature. An effective campaign against that portion of the Eddy law affecting the mining industry, was discussed and determined on.

The only other business transacted by the committee was election of a president in place of Mr. Friede. W. D. B. Dodson was chosen. The executive committee will put the association in closer touch with the heavy mining interests and will enlist the efforts of the entire industry in mining legislation,

J. H. Robbins of Baker county got a mining bill through the house and senate of the last legislature, providing for appointment of a mine inspector, who should also have the duties of a state geologist. Governor Chamberlain vetoed the measure, at the instance of several large operators. The association contemplates a state geologist rather than an inspector, whose duties are to gather and present authentic information of mineral resources, and who would not have any further powers than those of an educational nature. Such a measure is not likely to be opposed by any mining interests and will certainly receive the cordial support of the vast majority of small operators. California has a state geologist with duties of this scope, who publishes a large amount of literature of an authentic nature regarding state mines.

A committee of five is to be appointed to draft a bill, and to confer regarding other legislation to be asked this winter. This committee will get in touch with sil the representatives and senators of

### FOUR-FOOT VEIN OF COPPER IN CROSSCUT

"Our tunnel to intersect the Copperop-

"Our tunnel to intersect the Copperopolis vein to the northeast of where it was previously opened, is in a much better looking grade of vein matter. The work of the past week passed through a four-foot body of high-grade rock, which averaged at the point of intersection above 15 per cent copper, Quartzite and occasional bodies of white quartz are coming in at the face, and there seems little doubt that the tunnel is about to enter the main ore body, which has been thrown further than we estimated when we began driving for it."

This summarizes the situation at the Copperopolis property, Grant county, as set forth by Manager W. W. Gibbs this morning, upon his return from the district. Mr. Gibbs stated that the power drill had been taken from the other adit, and placed in the crosscut mentioned. Until the tunnel taps the ore body at this point, all work will be centered here. The body of copper ore opened was chalcopyrite, resembling very closely the character of ore found about 200 feet distant where another crosscut entered the main vein.

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT OF EAST WATER

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
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
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
