The bush tramp or "sundowner," as he is known seems to lose his identity after a few years of "humping the bluey" on the plains of Australia. No creature on earth could be more homeless or forlorn. He may have come of good family and have had prospects of inheritance till that fatal day when he was driven to the bush to hide his face forever from his people.

In the lonely wayside inns, which grow searcer and scarcer as he threads his way "out back," he finds the only semblance of a home on earth. The monotony of the Australian bush is appailing. One may traverse 100 miles without the slightest variation in the landscape—the same gum, the same succapputs, the same brown sunbaked earth. And overhead the perpetual screech of the cockatoe and the mocking laughter of the jackal. No wonder the tone of Australian literature is pessimism.

If by no other arms he can be distinguished from the ramp by his air of self possession and ecisive galt. From end to end of the ontinent he may be met—a study, heery son of nature, his eyes by long abit bent upon the ground and hope lways in his heart. In his "swag," or lanket, he carries a plain tin dish, the nly tool of the alluvial prospector, and ufficient food to last him a few days. his generally consists of "damper"—kind of crude bread he bakes with he flour bestowed upon him at the last omestead—and tea, which he makes in "billy," the inseparable companion of il denizens of the bush. Whatever else may discard from his meagre equipment, the "billy" cannot be dispensed ith.

A dozen times during the day he "boils the billy" and partakes of a long draught of block tea—milk and sugar being luxuries unthought of. For many days, and even weeks, he can exist on no other food but the eternal tea and "damper," as if in keeping with the monotony of his environment. Blessed is the way-farer who invites him to share a plug of tobacco. His festivals are held on the days when he arrives at some homestead, and such is the hospitality of the Australian bush that he never need beg. At the squatter's home there are accommodation and food for every passerby. One may rest himself and stable by. One may rest himself and stable its horse as he would at an inn, and it would be an unpardonable breach of the bush etiquette to offer payment for the accommodation.

The Austlarian bushman is a remanticist of the first order. Solitude seems to have strengthened his imagination and long absence from society to have heightened his powers of expression. He will tell the most impossible stories with absolute sincerity, his language being interlaced with adjectives of an imposing description, one of which he will at every opportunity sandwich in the middle of a word with remarkable effect. This system of syllabic swearing is considered the acme of conversational perfection. Unlike the tramp, he is not lost to sentiment, and he inherits an English love for ceremony.
