Payment of these mortgage claims was one of the purposes assigned by certain stockholders when authorising sale of the mining property recently, which was prohibited by a temporary restraining order issued by the federal court on the petition of Alexander Prussing. In the petition of Alexander Prussing. In Mr. Prussing's petition he asks that the sale be stopped as outlined and that regular foreclosure be adopted. The fact that the largest claim has been filed for foreclosure, as Mr. grussing asked, indicates that this procedure is satisfactory, and that the permanent injunction to be argued here January 16 may not be necessary.

#### OREGON CINNABAR IS **EASY VICTOR AT FAIR**

An unexpected honor won by Oregon mines at St. Louis was the bronze medal for the Blackbutte quicksilver mine of Lane county, on its clanabar exhibit. Manager W. B. Dennis was informed recently of this triumph over the exhibits of California and Texas, each of which made a protentious effort to capture the high prise. The Oregon mine was very lightly represented; only a small exhibit was sent to fill up space and in compliance with the general request for ores. The fact that such a collection of ore would win in competition with the laborate display of the two states which claim exclusive mercury rights, suggests what operators have sheen thinking for some time, that Oregon will soon become an important producer of this metal. The Blackbutte mine office has one of the finest cinabar exhibits of the world, which the management has gathered during the course of exploratory work, and had Mr. Dennis cared to have entered it at St. Louis, no doubt is felt that a gold medal would have been captured.

Spokane, Wash., Jan. 12.—The Standard Group Marble company, owning 200 acres near Bossburg, has opened up a new deposit of variegated marble that is said to be the prettiest product of ornamental stope discovered in that section of the country. The breast of the mineral exposed is 60 by 200 feet and contains almost all the colors. The company has expended about \$40,000 up to date in developing the property and it has ordered machinery for the quarries which will be installed in the spring.

## ENLARGE CONCENTRATOR.

Vancouver, B. C., Jan. 13.—A contract has been signed to enlarge the concentrator building of the Iron Mask mine. It is the intention of the management to have the enlarged building completed in readiness for the reopening of the concentrator in the spring. The addition to the building will cost \$7,500, clear of the enlargement of the plant which has just been decided upon by the visiting directors and which will nearly double the present capacity.

**GREAT INCREASE IN** COPPER PRODUCTION

Horace Stevens, the copper expert, has reviewed the copper industry for the year past, and finds evidence of the greatest increase in production known to the industry. Figures of the 1904 production are not yet available, but from what he has received, Mr. Stevens estimates that he total output in United States territory will exceed 783,700,000 pounds, as against 697,943,131 pounds for the preceding year.

ritory will exceed 783,700,000 pounds, as against 697,943,131 pounds for the preceding year.

He finds that Montana still leads in this country, with 267,000,000 pounds, as against 272,555,564 pounds for 1903. Michigan produced 206,250,000, against 122,259,191 for 1903. Arizona climbed from 147,643,271 in 1903 to 191,000,000 this year, and such an increase in 1906 will take the brilliant southwest territory to second place, with assurance of lead over all other states in two or three years. Utah's gain was from 38,302,602 to 52,500,000 pounds. Callfornia's rich Shasta and Siskiyou district went from 17,778,785 to 22,500,000, the splendid increase being due to work unhampered by strikes and larger reduction plants. The cast and south, which largely means Tennessee, is credited with 16,500.000, as against 12,256,612 for the preceding year. Alaska produced 2,000,000, against 1,230,500 for 1903. 
