TO GET PATENTS FOR INDIAN LAND

(Washington Bureau of The Journal.) Washington, D. C., Jan. 30.—Senator Fulton has proposed an amendment to the Indian appropriation bill providing that persons who have purchased lands of the Umatilla Indian reservation and made full payment shall be entitled to receive patents upon submitting proof to the land office that the lands purchased are exclusively grazing lands, and also the amendment providing for referring the claims of Chinook and Cathlamet Indians to the court of claims for judgment.

MISMANAGEMENT IS OFFICIALLY DENIED

DYNAMITERS WRECK A CHURCH IN SEATTLE (Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Seattle, Jan. 30.—Dynamiters wrecked the old First Presbyterian church, at the southeast corner of Third avenue and Madison street, shortly before 1 o'clock this morning. The partition between the living apartment in the rear of the building and the main hall was completely demolished, the front of the building blown out, and every window demolished. The windows in buildings for several hundred feet were also broken. Mystery surrounds the identity of the man or men who set off the explosive. No possible motive can be assigned.
