Victoria, B. C., Jan. 31.—The Canadian  
Pacific Railway company is negotiating  
for the purchase of the Esquimalt &  
Vancouver railway, which traverses Van-  
couver Island. The railway is now  
owned by James Dunsmuir, and the  
figures named for it is held to be over  
\$1,500,000.The Canadian Pacific railway is said  
to be seeking terminal facilities at  
Esquimalt for the Empress liners from  
the Orient and Australian Horns. By  
this means a saving of time and ex-  
pense would be accomplished. Instead  
of taking liners all the way to Van-  
couver, freight would be transferred and  
from steamers at Esquimalt, being  
brought here by means of the car-ferry  
now operated across the Straits of  
Georgia by the Esquimalt & Nanaimo  
railway.At present carfords lots are laid down  
in Victoria by this route and it might  
as well be increased to meet the de-  
mands of the Empress and Australian
