

CITIZENS AT MERCY OF BOB CRIMINALS

Many Burglaries and Robberies Committed and Police Unable to Control Malefactors.

J. A. MELTON SUFFERS LOSS FOR FOURTH TIME

Thieves Enter Rooms and Rob Sleeping Inmates of Clothes, Cash and Jewelry.

For the fourth time in the last two months the store of J. A. Melton, at 244 Gilman street, was broken into by thieves and a number of articles of value carried away last night.

Through an oversight the inner drawer of the safe was locked. This the thieves broke open with a sledgehammer, completely demolishing the inside of the safe.

Thieves entered the house of F. D. McDonald and B. A. Libby at Twenty-fifth and Upshur streets, last night and stole a lot of tools valued at \$40.

The rear door of a residence at 847 Corbett street was pried open and \$10 stolen from Mrs. Perry, who has a room there.

The house of Mrs. Stoughton, at 847 Corbett street, was broken into Sunday night by a burglar, who secured \$10. Entrance was effected through a window.

S. Ishii, a Japanese, was asleep at 25 North Third street early Monday morning when a burglar entered the room and stole \$70 from a trunk, which had been left unlocked.

Thomas Ray informed the police that a thief had stolen money and a number of articles from his room in a lodging house at 123 Twelfth street.

Wandering around the north end coastless and hatless James Harvey was arrested by Patrolman Gibson and booked on a charge of drunkenness.

AGENCIES FOR PUBLIC GOOD

Railroads Will Establish Them All Over the Coast for Use of Excursionists.

F. E. FRANKS TO MANAGE THE ONE IN PORTLAND

Fair Director Devers in Letter Compares Exposition Work With That of Liege.

Joint agencies have been established by the railroad companies for the purpose of validating excursion tickets to the Lewis and Clark fair.

At Portland the agency will be established at the union station, with F. E. Franks in charge. It will be open from May 13 to November 30.

The agency at Tacoma will be located at 225 Pacific avenue, with C. B. Foster in charge. The same dates announced for Portland will prevail.

At Seattle the agency will be located at the union station, with George B. Smallman in charge. The same dates will be observed there as at all other cities along the coast.

The Liege exposition is to open April 15, but, he says, work on the local fair was much more advanced when he left in December than it was at Liege when he wrote the letter.

PHILANTHROPIST'S BODY SHIPPED TO PALO ALTO

Friends and Police Guard With Secrecy Their Plans, Discoveries and Actions.

(Journal Special Service.) San Francisco, March 21.—Upon the arrival of the Alameda today with the remains of Mrs. Jane L. Stanford, unusual precautions were taken to prevent newspaper men from interviewing Berner and May Hunt, secretary and maid respectively, of the deceased.

Prof. David Starr Jordan and Attorney Wilson were non-committal, beyond saying that a statement which completely covered the case had been prepared but they did not know when it would be made public.

Detectives Reynolds and Cullundann declined to utter a word regarding the case. Their reports will be turned over to their superiors this evening.

After the bustle, reaction stirred the crowd and they thronged about the gank plank to see Misses Berner and Hunt descend.

In Miss Berner's carriage were her brother and Detectives Cullundann and Reynolds. This perhaps is the most significant fact brought out in the day's series of deeply veiled events.
