Williams and Hunt Name Men With Bad Records on the Pelice Force.

HUNTER NOTORIOUS IN NORTH END DIVES

To Add to Scandal, Patrolman Fones is Restored on Threats of Talking.

Scandal in the police department, fol-lowing the appointment of 28 patrolmen by Mayor Williams and Chief Hunt is growing in magnitude. The cover was removed from the caldron by publication in part of the record of Wirlie Hunter. in part of the record of Wirlie Hunter, one of the appointees. Other charges are now made against Hunter, the most pertinent being that he was "booster" for a gambling game at Fritz' saloon on Burnside street, while questions have been raised as to the fitness of others of the patrolmen to hold their positions.

That Mayor Williams and the police commissioners appreciate the serious nature of the charges against Hunter is shown by their failure to place him on a beat. Senator Sichiel was in conference with Chief Hunt for some time yesterday. Hunter was told to report at police headquarters at 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

It has developed that the officer to whom Hunter applied two years ago to see if some way could not be found to cause Sergeant Church to "lie down" and cease arresting an unfortunate woman under the protecting wing of the new patrolman is Captain Bailey. The captain was called into Chief Hunt's private office yesterday and questioned relative to the charge against Hunter,

Another appointment to the force, also said to have been made on the recommendation of Chief Hunt, which has led to caustic criticism, is that of Robert Phillips. This patrolman was on the force for some time, but resigned last February, declaring the pay was too small. It is alleged by certain patrolmen that Phillips has none too savory a reputation and has been the object of considerable street talk on account of the relations he bore to a woman.

To add to the scandal, the department is discussing the reinstatement of Patrolman L. C. Fones, suspended on March 20 by the venerable chief. Though went on duty at 12:30 yesterday, his pay is to be allowed from April J. This means practically that half the time he apont under suspension was in the nature of a vication, with pay.

Fones met Mayor Williams, Police Commissioner Sichel and Chief Hunt in conference Friday afternoon. It is answrited that at that time be declared his intention of 'making trouble' by telling everything he knew which would reflect unfavorably on the department if he were not reinstated. The action of the police commission shows that the members did not care to force him to make good his threat.

Oii Field Conditions.

Oil Field Conditions. Mr. John Gloyn, of Spokane, who has just returned from the oil fields of East

Kootenay, B. C., says:

"Conditions are most favorable for the largest boom in oil known for many pears. The reason for the excitement is the phenomenal results of the companies operating in the field, four producing wells have been brought in, and a refinery is under construction. From a widerness has sprung up the thriving booming town of Oil City. Two transcontinental railways contemplate building into the field this coming sumtranscontinental railways contemplate building into the field this coming summer, one of which now has its engineers in the field. Ranchers are leaving their farms to run stage lines and haul freight into the new center, sawmills are busy supplying building material and buildings are going up like mushrooms in a night. The excitement is not confined to the Canadians alone as different parties from this side of the line are buying claims in the district with the intention of operating either close corporations or as joint stock companies. "From Winnipeg to Victoria, people are becoming very much interested, and in a very short time, from present indications, hundreds of rigs will be sinking wells to tap the oil sands which are found at depths ranging from hold to 1,200 feet. The fine quality of the oil and the protection given by the Canadian government is a great factor

the oil and the protection given by the Canadian government is a great factor in so many people leaving otner oil fields and crossing the line into Canada.

"When I first went into the oil country," said Mr. Gloyn, "I met a party of Americans, under Professor Hermann, who had just returned from the oil fields of Russia. Professor Hermann said that Canada was not aware how valuable a region she possessed, and that Pennsylvania never presented as promising indications of oil as this field did. Development has been retarded in these fields owing to the opposition of the Canadian Pacific railway, tarded in these fields owing to the op-position of the Canadian Pacific railway, which, for a long time, made strenuous efforts to get possession of the territory as a land grant. After years of litiga-tion the government decided to recognize the rights of locators by granting title, and the way is now open for the full development of the resources of this rich district."
