Unthinkable Conditions of Filthiness Discovered by Committee That Inspects City Shops

FOOD PRODUCTS OPEN TO POISONOUS GERMS

Dirt. Stench, Putrefaction Are Al the Result of Criminal Carelessness.

They first visited a well regulated creamery, where the conditions were good and next entered a large creamery several blocks away. There they found things entirely different. The floors were littered with ill-smelling rubbish, the churning room was separated from other establishments by low partitions and the kitchen of an ill-smelling restaurant and a fish market opened into the creamery.

At a fish market they found a large quantity of shrimps which had been treated with a poisonous preservative instead of having been placed in cold storage. They found veal that was so young that the women sickened at the sight. Food was exposed in large quantities on the counters where foul air and dust permeated with germs could reach it. Chickens and turkeys were found which had not been drawn and were blue and black because they had been dead so long. In the rear of the establishments they visited, without exception, they found filth in great quantities. Barrels of pickels, sauerkraut and meats stood open everywhere so that dirt could lodge in them, and in one storeroom a chicken picking gang made its headquarters.

The sights fully convinced the women that conditions were not as they should be. They have decided that some action is necessary to secure a competent inspector and deputies to look after shops, markets and kitchens, and they will send a delegation before the city council and ask that body to appoint an inspector and one or more deputies.

An ordinance is now pending in the city council which provides for an inspector and three deputies, but the members have not manifested any great interest in it. It is said there is no money available to provide for the saiaries of any additional health office deputies.

Dr. H. R. Blersdorf, city health officer, agrees with the women that an inspector of markets should be appointed. He says great sood would result. He has only one deputy and they have more than they can altend to. Recently he
