Modern Bluebeard at the Bar of Justice for Poisoning His Spouse.

SIX EARLY WIVES APPEAR AS WITNESSES

Chicago, April 13.—Johann Hoch, the "modern bluebeard" and confessed blasphemist, was placed on trial today for the alleged murder of Mrs. F. Maria Walker Hoch, one of his many wives, before Judge Kersten in the criminal court. Hoch was indicted for murder in the first degree, it having been proved that Mrs. Walker Hoch died of arsenical poisoning, presumably administered by Hoch.

Helena, Mont., April 13.—The \$5,000,000 suit of the Nipper Consolidated Mining company against the Parrot Silver and Copper Mining company within a week, came up before Judge William H. Hunt today on application, and the argument occupied the entire day, after which Judge Hunt took the matter under advisement.

BROKE THE LAW FROM FORCE OF CIRCUMSTANCES

Mayor Williams has stated that he will have no political club to boom his candidacy. He is the president of a club of several hundred voters to push his candidacy before 10,000 voters. The mayor places responsibility for the policy of licensing gambling on the shoulders of the city council, which he believes, and states that he merely coincided with them in what they insisted was necessary to maintain the city government.

MONTANA GOES AFTER BEEF TRUST PEOPLE

Helena, Mont., April 13.—Feeling that the so-called beef trust people, Armour, Swift, Cudahy and Hammond, had been given ample time to make an appearance in court, and failed to do so, Attorney-General Galen has secured the issuance of a summons from the district court here, requiring their appearance on April 25 to answer an information made and filed against them by the attorney-general of the state of Montana, charging that they wilfully, unlawfully and feloniously combined with each other for the purpose of unlawfully fixing the price of certain articles of commerce for consumption by the people of the state of Montana, to-wit:
