

TACOMA RAILWAY AFTER COPPER ORE

St. Helens Has Prospect of Line Within Twelve Miles of Mines.

THIS WOULD DIVERT ALL TRAFFIC TO THE SOUND

Unless the Castle Rock Route Is Encouraged, Portland Has No Show.

Late reports from southern Washington indicate great activity by the management of the Tacoma & Eastern railway, which is projected for entry into the Cowlitz basin near St. Helens this year.

The effect of this work is against Portland interests, as the outlet for that country is being fixed far to the north. Had a line been constructed from Castle Rock up the Toulce, extending the present logging road, Portland would have had an even break with Tacoma in competing for ore and general traffic of St. Helens, or possibly an advantage, owing to the character of the haul in this direction.

OREGON SECURITIES MADE FIRST CLEAN-UP

The first clean-up at the Oregon Securities mill in Bohemia, was made on the first of the month.

The exact amount of bullion recovered from this work was not stated, but for the time that the plant was running, the management was entirely satisfied with results.

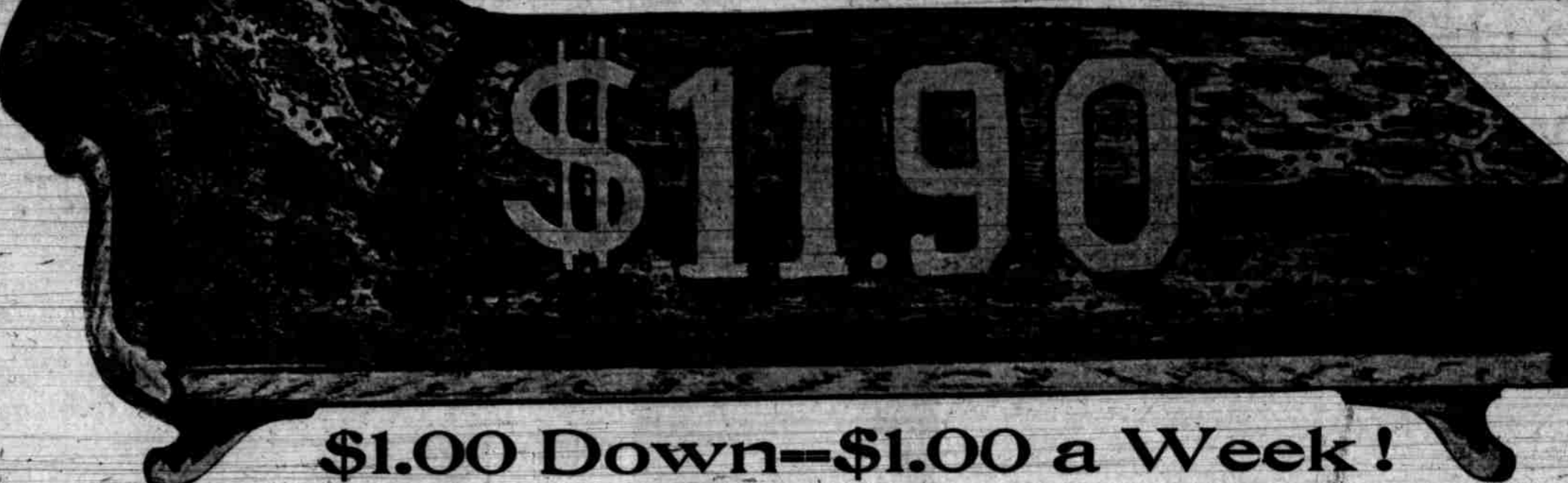

BREWERS PREPARED FOR A LONG SIEGE

No Financial Assistance or Sympathetic Aid But Along Lines of Boycott.

Seattle, May 4.—There will not be a sympathetic strike in connection with the brewery trouble in western Washington. This statement is given out by Business Agent W. J. Akers of the Western Central Labor union which, at its meeting last night, endorsed the stand taken by the various brewery unions and promised to give them support.

The statement is made that the brewers are prepared to carry on a long war and it will be entirely along the lines of a boycott. Chief Cook of the fire department has suspended Lieutenant Peter Kump of Engine Company No. 1 and George Valbus, pipeman of Truck No. 1, for playing the hose on the brewery wagons which were passing the station.

Trousdale, Or., May 4.—Arrangements are being made by the Woman's club of this town for a permanent home for the library. For three years the library has been pushed from pillar to post with no permanent location. The women have leased a piece of ground, south of the depot, from the O. R. & N. Co., and money is being raised for the construction of a building.

The deal is now under way and it is reported that it will probably be concluded this week.
