Portland Dealers Say Owners Discriminate Against Them in Favor of Bay City.

STORES FOR OCEAN CRAFT SENT FROM CALIFORNIA

Merchants Will Try to Have Purchases Made at This Port Hereafter.

Portland dealers believe the stores for the schooners loading at this port should be supplied by them instead of by the merchants of San Francisco.

The manner in which these stores are now bought, said Mr. Hageman this morning, is a result of the discrimination against the merchants of Portland.

All of the steamers and steam schooners plying between the Columbia river and San Francisco are outfitted at the latter place, and it is expected that this plan will be continued, as they call there regularly.
