

ELLIOTT'S REPORTS NEVER QUESTIONED

Mayor, Testifying in Riner Case, Says Engineer Had Full Authority.

STATED SEWER WORK WAS OF THE VERY BEST

Greenleaf Says Under Oath Conduit Is All That It Should Not Be.

Yesterday afternoon three witnesses whose statements were to form the substance of the state's proof that the sewer was defective—Mayor Williams, City Engineer Wanner and Civil Engineer R. E. Greenleaf called and supported the allegation that the work done by Mr. Riner was not according to the plans and specifications.

Mayor Williams was called as chairman of the executive board. He placed the burden of the acceptance of defective construction on W. C. Elliott, who was city engineer when the sewer was building.

Mr. Elliott was present when the matter came before the board and stated to us that the work was done properly. It was particularly careful to ask him about the character of the work and referred to the plans and specifications, and he was explicit in saying that everything was done as it should have been done.

Attorney Mendenhall indicated that he expected to get up the technical requirements of the plans and specifications that not one item in addition would be admitted by the defense as essential to Riner's assertion that he had fulfilled all he had to do in building the sewer.

It was constructed so that when the outside timbers supporting the false work rotted away, the whole structure would fall," said O'Neill.

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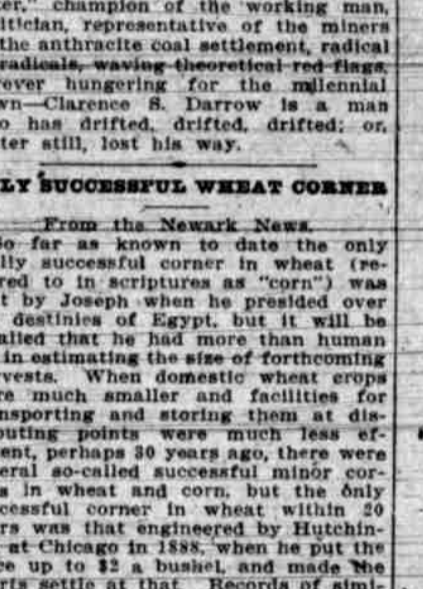
