NEW POTATOES OFF HANDS ARE FIRMER

But Two Cars of Eastern in Market to Tide Demand Over for About a Month.

EGGS ARE FIRM, WHILE CHICKENS REMAIN WEAK

Hops Sell at Quoted Figures—Crop in Good Shape—Cabbage is Quoted Off.

Front Street, June 23.—The principal features of the Portland market today are: New potatoes down, old firmer. California onions quoted lower. But of southern origin good. Receipts of Columbia about better. Green peas in cheaper shape. Watermelons have a fair sale. Expected car arrivals extra. Eggs are firm; chickens dull. Cabbage plentiful and lower. Peaches come in better shape. Very small demand for blackberries. Loganberries scarce; price asked too high. Pecan nuts, fruit jars. Hops are selling at present price.

New Potatoes Down; Old Firmer.

Receipts of local new potatoes are now quite heavy and the market is becoming more active. Shippers there are sending their tubers to market as soon as possible on account of the reported ravages of an unknown disease which is destroying a large portion of the crop in the rich potato fields of that section. Quality of the Oregonians is now better than those from the south and this accounts in some measure for the higher prices ruling on the former. Old potatoes have been coming in quite freely during the week, but shippers now say that with the exception of a car or two due within the next day or so no more will be received the present season. It is now estimated that there are but 10 cars of old potatoes in this market. The trade up to this time has been using two cars a day, but this demand down to one car or less from this time forth. The season for old potatoes will close about a month to run this season, so there is no likelihood of any severe bolt in the prices now.

Receipts of Onions from the South are Now Quite Heavy and Some Concessions are Being Made in the Price in Order to Keep the Tones of the Market Healthy.

The run of salmon to the southern Oregon streams is now quite large and these form the main receipts of fresh fish in the Portland market today. The demand is excellent at former quotations. The run of shad in the Columbia is showing an improvement, but the demand is excellent and readily absorbs all the fish that comes at former values.

Watermelons Have a Fair Sale.

About the car of cantaloupes which was yesterday George Pearson of the firm says: "We have just received a message that the nights have been too cool for rapid growth of the melons and the car could not be shipped with that product alone."
