Prediction Made by Colonel John H. Carroll of Missouri, a Globe Observer.

EVERYTHING IN STATE TO MAKE PORTLAND GREAT

Country Will Be as Prosperous and Powerful Commercially as New England.

"In 25 years Portland will have 500,000 people, Seattle will have as many, there will be other large cities throughout the Pacific northwest and this country will be as prosperous and powerful commercially as New England.

Colonel Carroll, lawyer and man of affairs, traveler, bon vivant on occasions, Hoosier by birth and Missourian by adoption, is making a tour of the Pacific northwest, in the private car Starlight, accompanied by a party of eastern friends.

"I saw millions of feet of black walnut and oak cut and burned away to clear the land and I am only 47 years old," he said.
