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PEOPLE COME TO HEAR THE PAPERS Nurserymen From All Over Pacific Coast Invite Public to Their Convention. ADDRESSES WILL BE OF INTEREST TO ALL CLASSES Many Delegates Here or Gathering From Nearly All of the Northwestern States. From all parts of the Pacific coast people are assembling here for the annual convention of the Pacific Coast Association of Nurserymen, which opened this morning in Knights of Pythias hall, Marquam building. President J. B. Pilkington of this city called the convention to order, which spent the morning hours with light routine business, preliminary to the more important session to be held tomorrow. This afternoon officers of the association will be elected, and everything pushed through to give the members in readiness for the papers on tomorrow's program. In the morning technical papers, devoted to the interests of nurserymen, will be read by members of the association, and any who desire to hear them will be welcome at the meeting. In the afternoon there is to be a more popular program, when prominent horticulturists will speak, a fine fruit display will be made, and fruit and refreshments will be served. The afternoon session will be especially attractive to the public. Some of the addresses will be by Professor Van Dusen, formerly United States entomologist, and now in charge of the fruit wards at the Lewis and Clark exposition, who is regarded as one of the most eminent fruit authorities of the country, and by an especially prominent horticulturist of the state of Washington, who will also speak. A large quantity of excellent fruit is being gathered for display, and choice oranges and California apples are assembling in force. The officers of the association are J. B. Pilkington, Portland, president; C. A. Tomson, Tacoma, secretary and treasurer; A. C. McHugh, Seattle, and H. Rowland, Albany, Oregon, and A. Stewart, Christopher, Washington, members of the executive committee. The vice-presidents of the association are H. A. Lewis, Russellville, Oregon; J. Hartley, Caldwell, Idaho; A. P. Dix, Salt Lake City, Utah, and F. W. Powers, Chico, California.

CHESTERFIELD 25c. Fungus Diseases and Insect Pests Are Numerous—Hops Are Growing. Latest crop bulletin of department of agriculture: The past week has been favorable for normal growth, notwithstanding it averaged cooler than usual. Haying is now general and although considerable hay was cut and lying in the fields when the rains of the past few days occurred, no great damage ensued, and the hay crop promises to be unusually heavy and of excellent quality. Fall wheat continues to fill nicely and its growth is well advanced. It will be ready to cut in about ten days or two weeks. Fungus diseases and insect pests are more troublesome than usual at this season of the year. Spring wheat in portions of the Willamette valley is badly infested with aphids, but otherwise its condition is promising. Oats are affected by a red rust fungus, which is causing much apprehension. Barley is ripening nicely. Corn, gardens, potatoes, field onions and sugar beets continue doing well. Manure has not been reported in the hop yards, especially those situated near the river bottoms, and preparations for extensive spraying have been made, which will be put in operation if the present warlike and bright weather does not cause their disappearance. Berries are plentiful, and other fruit has made satisfactory advancement.
