IDAHO FRAUDS

Lewiston Banker and His Clerk Taken Under Custody for Alleged Swindles.

INDICTED PERSON SAID TO HAVE LEFT COUNTRY

Citizen Under Suspicion Reported to Have Borrowed Money on His Property and to Have Disappeared -Developments Expected.

Lewiston, July 22.—The first arrests in the Lewiston land fraud-cases were made yesterday, when George H. Kester, cashier of the Lewiston National bank, and Clarence Robnett, his bookkeeper, were placed under arrest by United States Marshal Schattner and taken before Commissioner E. O'Nel, where they were placed under bonds of \$2,000 each. The bonds were accepted with two sureties, J. Alexander, C. F. Osmers and John Dill being the bondsmen, Osmers being on both bonds.

A bench warrant is said also to be out against W. F. Kettenbach, president of the bank, but he is out of the city, being in Portland to attend the bankers' association.

Warrants for William Dwyer and Jackson O'Keefe, both of Asotin county. Washington, have been placed in the hands of Spokane officers, who are expected to make the arrests today.

These are the first of the Idaho land fraud cases and interesting developments are expected in the trial of the cases at Moscow during the Caber term of the federal cours.

It is reported that one of the citisens of Lewiston who had reason to believe his actions were being investigated, borrowed \$7,500 on his property and left the country before the deputy had time to get there with the bench warrant.
