"Yes, he died six months ago, and since then I have seen a circus rider."

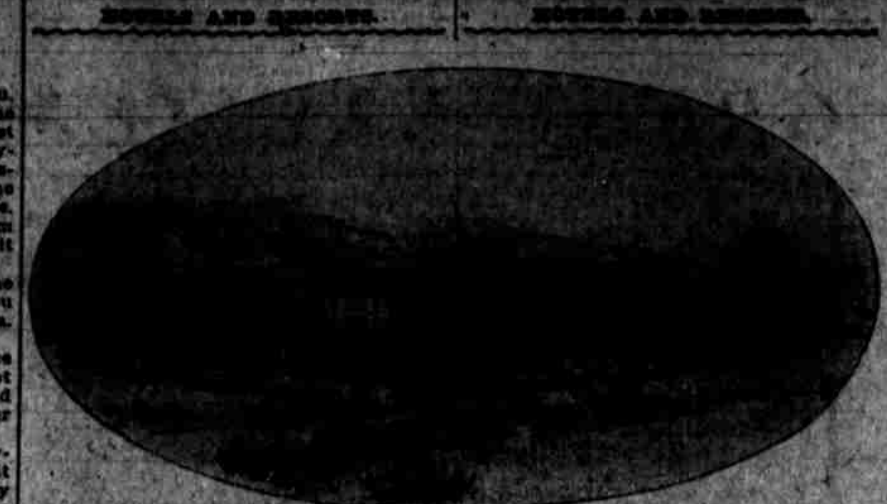
"But, my God, how is that possible? Have you then no relations?"
