NATIVES OF CELEBES FIGHTING THE DUTCH

Singapore, July 25. — The Celebes islanders, armed with modern magasine rifles, are in rebellion against the Dutch authorities. Finally the horses ran away and wrecked the wagon. The youngest child wandered away and was lost on the desert, atiners at last found the family and, after supplying them food, guided them to Searchlight, Nevada.

## FIFTY MEN LIFT CAR

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)

New York, July 25.—When 2-year-old Ignacio Biogio was run over by a car in front of his home yesterday and his right foot crushed under the forward wheels, 50 then lifted the car so the child could be released.

Paris, July 25.—According to the Petit Parisien. Jacques Lebaudy, the seifstyled "Emperor of Sahara." who for some time has been in eclipse, has sent a note to Prime Minister Rouvier claiming redress for alleged injuries. He threatens if his demand is not complied with that he will declare war against France. Incidentally he warns others that "if his majesty Jacques be made the victim of hostile or disloyat acts on the part of other human beings living, this planet government of Sahara will punish those individuals."

### CARTER WILL REMAIN **GOVERNOR OF HAWAII**

Oyster Bay, July 25.—The president has declined to accept the resignation of George R. Carier as governor of Hawaii. Carter was advised to go back to Honolulu, where he will have the full support and sympathy of the national administration. ### COURT HOLDS COLLINS MUST BE EXTRADITED


