Development of Corn Crop. "When agriculture began to develop in eastern Oregon, after the first stages of settlement when livestock grazing was the only resource of the settler, wheat and barley were thought to be the limit of cereal production. It was argued that the nights were too cool to raise corn and some other grains which are produced in profusion.
