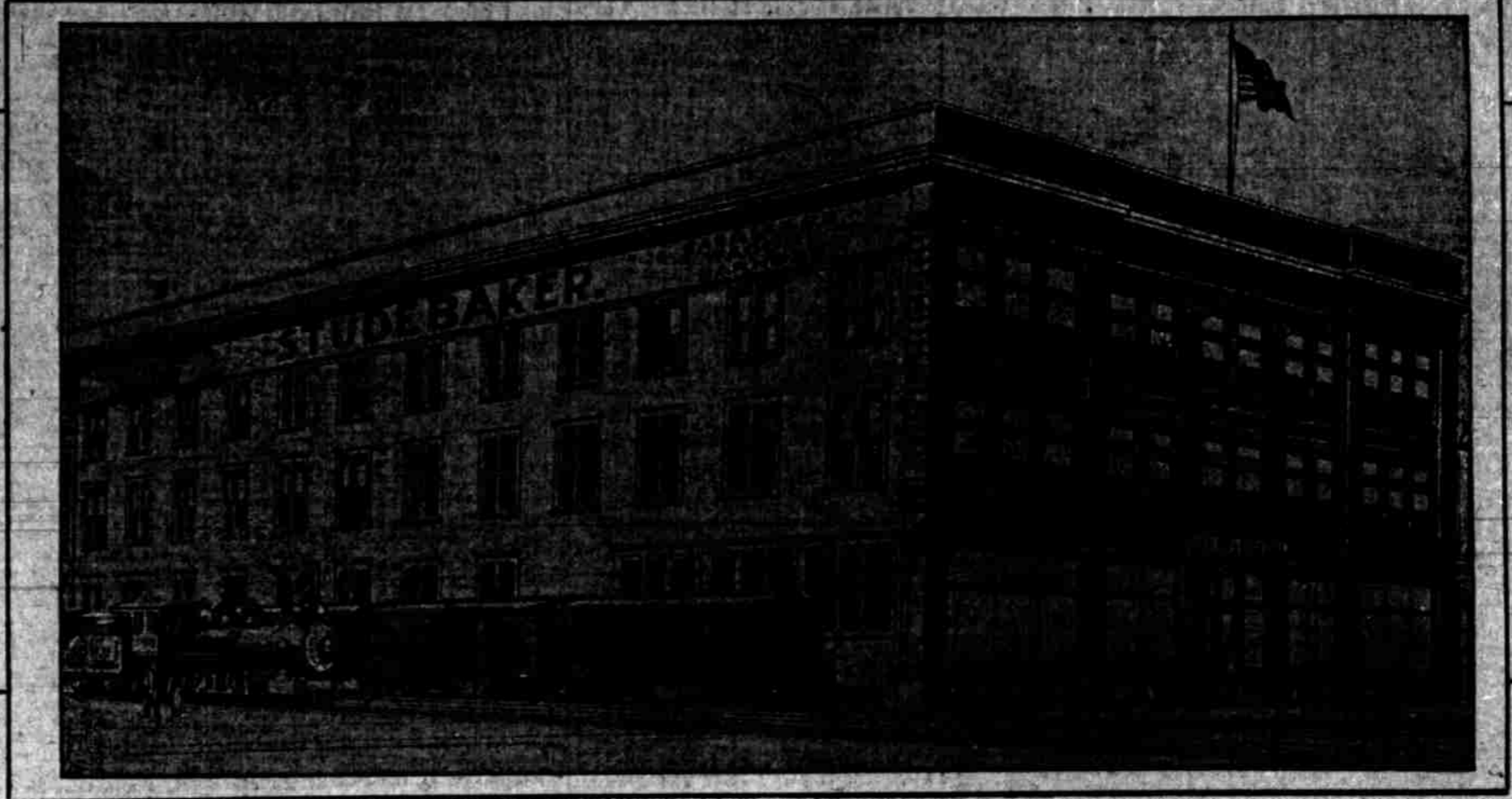

## COLUMBIA RIVER IS VERY LOW AT THE DALLES

Long Dry Hot Spell is Record-Breaker for Wasco and Has Damaged Crops.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) The Dalles, Ore., July 29.—Government Weather Reporter S. L. Brooks says that the weather this year has been exceedingly hot and for a longer period than ever known here before. While the temperature has not been so high as in several former years the long continued spell of hot weather has done more damage to grain and fruit than other years. The hottest weather known here occurred in 1875, when the thermometer ranged from 90 to 104 for 10 consecutive days. In 1898 there were nine days of hot weather with the temperature ranging from 95 to 104 and in 1899 eight days over 90, while this year from July 17 until July 27 the thermometer has stood at 90 to 101.

Reports coming in from the country surrounding The Dalles are that the winter wheat is more or less shriveled and that late spring wheat is good only for hay. Italian and Hungarian prunes are badly scorched, and one man reported that the apples were cooked on the south side of the trees. Late planted potatoes will yield only half a crop. The long dry and hot weather has also caused creeks and springs to dry up which have never been dry before, and the Columbia river today is 13.5, which is two and a half feet lower than Mr. Brooks has any record of, and is falling steadily.

## ADMIT SWEARING FALSELY IN LIQUOR TRIAL

Case Against Jacob Blumberg at Corvallis Develops New Features.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Corvallis, Ore., July 29.—There are new developments in the case of Jacob Blumberg, who sold liquor in violation of the local option law, and was fined \$50 and costs about 10 days ago. This was Blumberg's second offense and he appealed the case to the Benton circuit court. At the trial witnesses testified to seeing Blumberg pass what looked to be a bottle to John McGee and that McGee handed something back to Blumberg. McGee was at once arrested and a bottle of liquor found on his person. At the trial, however, McGee swore that he did not get the liquor of Blumberg, and Blumberg denied having sold it to McGee.

The new features are a full confession by Blumberg to Prosecuting Attorney E. R. Bryson admitting his guilt, according to the evidence introduced at the trial. Also a confession by McGee to the same effect before Justice Holgate. The confessions are the result of a movement started by Attorney Bryson for the bringing of two cases of perjury, a witness having broken down in the attorney's office and disclosed certain facts of importance in the case.

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## HEAVILY FINED

Sentenced to Pay Five Hundred Dollars and Serve Five Days in Jail.

## ALLEGED TO HAVE OBSTRUCTED JUSTICE

In Case Against Him Lawyer Thresher Filed Affidavits of Disqualification Against Five Trial Judges in District Court.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Butte, Mont., July 29.—B. S. Thresher, one of the best known attorneys in this city, was fined \$500 and committed to the county jail for five days for contempt, committed in the presence of the court and using dilatory tactics to hinder and delay the administration of justice. This action was taken after the court held a private conference with Thresher on his reason for filing an affidavit of disqualification against the judge. The suit was that of A. W. Barnard against B. S. Thresher. Judge Henry C. Smith of Helena was the sixth judge to be called on account of affidavits of disqualification filed by Thresher.

Before imposing the fine the judge asked Thresher to make public the statements he had privately made to the court or to allow the court to do so, but Thresher refused. Thresher asked for a stay of execution but the court refused it, saying that sentence would only be held in abeyance long enough to try the main case.

The trouble is the outgrowth of a suit instituted by A. W. Barnard to evict Thresher for failing to pay office rent for the last three years. Barnard beat Thresher in the justice court, Thresher appealing to the district court and then filed affidavits of disqualification against five judges called to hear the case, alleging bias and prejudice.
