The market on grapes is following closely that of tomatoes. It is being regarded as poor in from every direction. California shipments in this direction are showing a constant increase.

Poultry Market Remains Dead.

The butter market shows slightly better activity, but the market is very firm with prices unchanged. Receipts are not heavy, but the trade is better.
