### CITY MAY CLOSE THE STREET

Executive Board Threatens to Barricade First, Between Stark and Burnside.

PROPERTY OWNERS ARE WARNED TO REPAIR IT

Pavement is in a Very Dangerous Condition and if Action is Not Taken at Once Expensive Accidents are Likely to Happen.

First street between Stark and Burnside streets must be improved or the city executive board will take steps to close the thoroughfare. The pavement is of brick and has become so worn that it is filled with great holes and gullies which make travel extremely dangerous. The property owners have been trying to get the city to repair it out of the street repair fund, but the street committee of the executive board could not consent because of the large expenditure.

A resolution will be presented to the city council asking that immediate steps be taken to improve the thoroughfare. If the council refuses to act the executive board will instruct the city engineer to barricade the street. It was stated at the street committee meeting yesterday that the street railway companies were willing to lay their share of the pavement.

Howard Whiting, agent for the Carbolineum Wood Preserving company, made a statement regarding the condition of Holladay avenue from the steel bridge to Larrabee street where the wood block laid by the company had bulged into miniature mountain ranges since the rain. He laid the blame on Captain Wanser, ex-city engineer, stating that preserving the blocks and placing them on the street was done under the personal direction of the city engineer. The company, Whiting said, protested against Wanser's method of treating the blocks. Whiting stated that although the company was not at fault for the condition of the street, to show its good faith it would repair the pavement and guarantee to maintain it under a bond. The matter was deferred for investigation.

A bill for \$782.86 presented by the Trinidad Asphalt company for repairing asphalt pavements was recommended to the city council for payment. Although the repairs had not been properly authorized by the city the work was found to have been well done.

Inspectors in the city engineer's office will not be granted the increase in salaries asked, as there are no available funds.
