**EJECTING SQUATTERS FROM SNAKE SAND BAR**  
(Special Service.)  
Lawton, Idaho, Sept. 22.—Ejectment suits were commenced yesterday to remove 27 squatters from a tract known as the sandbar on Snake river, and in the southern part of the city. For many years squatters have resided on the tract and have erected numerous huts and cottages. The land is owned by F. W. Kettnerbach and the Clendenen estate, and suits were filed yesterday to clear the tract of the unwelcome occupants. The land in question was acquired by homestead entry about 20 years ago, and has been deeded land for the past 15 years. During recent years a number of the squatters have laid claim to their holdings, claiming a title by occupation, and it is expected several suits to establish ownership will result.
