Exercises in Honor of Father of Oregon Held in Auditorium.

ABIGAIL SCOTT DUNIWAY ALSO IS REMEMBERED

Tomorrow is Jefferson and Public Schools Day—Total Admissions When Fair Ends May Reach Two and One Half Millions.

The attendance at the fair up to 11:30 o'clock this morning was 3,452. Yesterday 17,431 people passed through the gates. This makes the total attendance 2,313,381.

This is Dr. John McLoughlin day at the fair and honor is being paid to the memory of a man so prominent in the pioneer history of the state that he is remembered as the "Father of Oregon."

Exercises began at 2 o'clock this afternoon in the Auditorium under the auspices of the Oregon Historical society.

Dr. McLoughlin was born in Parish La Riviere du Loup, Canada, October 14, 1784. He sailed the first wheat in Oregon in 1825.

The day is also known as Abigail Scott Duniway day, in honor of a woman pioneer whose life story is intimately linked with Oregon pioneer days.

A large attendance is expected at the exercises held in Mrs. Duniway's honor this afternoon at the Oregon building.

The program in honor of Mrs. Duniway has been prepared by a committee of her intimate friends.

Tomorrow will be Thomas Jefferson day and Public Schools day. Exercises in honor of the father of the nation will take place at the Auditorium at 2:30 o'clock in the afternoon.

REPUBLICANS MEET IN BAY STATE

Nominating Full State Ticket—Curtis Guild Leading Candidate for Governor.

Congressman Lawrence is Chosen Chairman

Selection is Compromise Between Contending Factions—Draper Will Be Named for Lieutenant Governor and Malone for Attorney General.

Boston, Oct. 6.—The state convention of the Republican party of Massachusetts was called to order at Tremont temple this morning by the chairman of the executive committee, J. W. Weeks, a Draper man, was made chairman.

The number of delegates who responded to the roll call was 1,812, seven less than at the state convention last year.

The basis of representation was the same as last year. After the defeat of Governor Bates last year it was pointed out that some towns and cities would suffer heavily in the next state convention as a result of knifing Bates.

After the customary preliminaries the chairman of the convention appointed the following committee on resolutions: G. P. Lawrence, chairman; G. E. Kunnard, North Andover; G. E. Keith, Brockton; Willard Howland, Chelsea; and H. M. Phillips, Springfield.

The selection of Congressman Lawrence for chairman of the committee on resolutions was a compromise decided upon in the interest of harmony between the factions and to meet any charge of undue favoritism.

There is little doubt in well informed circles that Draper will be nominated for lieutenant-governor and Malone for attorney-general and Lieutenant-Governor Curtis Guild will be nominated for governor.

PARK BOARD IS OFFICIALS

Old Promise to Erect Monument in City Pleasure Grounds is Unfulfilled.

Another demand will be made by the city park board on the Lewis and Clark corporation to erect the Lewis and Clark monument in the city park as planned when the movement was first started to hold an exposition in this city.

It was provided that the fair officials should expend a limited sum of money in erecting the monument in honor of the pathfinders and work on the monument proceeded so far that the foundation was laid and the granite shaft placed on the ground ready to be carved and erected.

Last spring the park board demanded that the work be finished, but after conferring with President Gooden permission was granted the fair officials to use the money set aside for the erection of the monument until after the fair closed when the memorial would be raised.

The park board deems that the time has come for work on the monument to proceed and has asked the city council to direct a letter to Colonel Jackson, in charge of the erection of the monument to the Lewis and Clark monument in the park block, instructing him to proceed with the raising of the memorial.

The work has been delayed for several months for a cause unknown to the park board.

To Change Inauguration Day. As chairman of the national committee on the proposed change of inauguration day, Commissioner Macfarlane has called a meeting of the committee for Wednesday, November 4, at which the manner of the presentation of the subject to congress at its coming session will be considered.

Two questions in particular are to be settled: Whether the committee should advocate the selection of any particular day as, for example, April 30, George Washington's inauguration day, or the last Thursday in April, the day named in Senator Hoar's resolution, which passed the senate unanimously two years ago and was supported by this committee as the day to which the inauguration should be changed.

Speaker's Daughter May Wed. A rumored engagement, which so far has failed to materialize, is one expected from the home of the speaker of the house of representatives, Uncle Joe Cannon. J. G. Thompson, an assistant attorney in the department of justice, has long been known to be devoted to the daughter of the speaker, who is her father's graceful and tactful secretary. Miss Cannon is not young, being on the shady side of 35. She is fat and jolly and enjoys her freedom immensely. She runs over to Europe for a few weeks as often as the position takes her away from her father and looks not with desire upon any circumscribed manner of living.

Two companies ordered to Monterey. Transfer Made Necessary by Departure of Fifteenth Infantry for Philippines.

Vancouver, Wash., Oct. 6.—Pursuant to orders from the War Department the division of the Pacific, General Constant Williams, commander of the department of the Columbia, has issued orders to Major Dyer to proceed to Monterey, California, with two companies of the Fourteenth infantry. It has not been decided which companies will be transferred. This change in the disposition of the Fifteenth infantry, now stationed at Monterey, for the Philippines. The transfer will be made about November 1.

Barton-Logan Bridge Proposition Dropped. The Oregon Water Power & Railway company desired to have the bridge built, as at present, provided this 70 per cent of the cost, provided this 70 per cent should not exceed \$4,000. Plans were drawn and bids were called for. The lowest bid called for an expenditure of more than \$13,000. The court refused to raise more than \$4,000 and the railroad company only offered about \$2,500. The matter came up in the meeting of the county commissioners this morning and the certified check of the lowest bidder was returned to them and the proposition was dropped.
