The doctor and undertaker in Baker City who examined the body of the Chinaman both believed that the Chinaman had not killed himself, as an examination showed that he had been shot in the back of the head with a 20-30 Winchester rifle. Local Chinese were not satisfied with the story of the Greenhorn people and through the Chinese consul at San Francisco a detective was put on the case. Rumor says that he has discovered important facts, and that a man connected with the mine will be placed under arrest soon. Previous to the shooting there had been the utmost hostility to Chinese in the Greenhorn district, and all but the one killed had been driven out by the miners.
