

ARTISANS INITIATE 50 CANDIDATES

Many Portland Members Journey to Kalama to Participate in Ceremonies.

SELLWOOD OFFICIALS IN CHARGE OF AFFAIR

All Partake of Banquet After Initiation Is Over—Order in Flourishing Condition and the Wealthiest Per Capita in America.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Kalama, Wash., Nov. 4.—Tonight 500 members of the order of United Artisans attended the first district meeting of the order and witnessed the initiation of 50 candidates.

The district comprises the lodges at Kalama, Castle Rock, Kelso, Clatskanie, Holm, Scappoose and Warrenton. Officers of the Sellwood assembly of Portland arrived here yesterday to officiate at the initiations.

The assembly from Houlton, consisting of about 40 members, departed the steamer Young America arriving here about 8 p. m.

A large number of members from the Fram assembly of Portland were visitors. A series of 10 district meetings have been arranged by officers of the order.

WIDOW BARRED FROM PLACE AT HUSBAND'S BIER WILL URGE APPROPRIATION FOR COLUMBIA WORK

Dead Man's Son is Accused of Stealing Will and Locking Out Stepmother.

(Special Dispatch by Leased Wire to The Journal.) Los Angeles, Nov. 4.—Refused admittance to the room where her husband was lying, denied possession of his body and charging that a will leaving her the greatest part of his fortune which is believed to amount to upward of \$40,000 has been stolen.

Nordell Myron, a stepson, who has charge of the funeral arrangements and who refused his stepmother admittance to the death chamber also will be at the funeral. The two are at swords points.

Through her attorney, Senator Henry R. Carter, Mrs. Myron not only declares that the will which she has seen and will swear left her the larger part of her property has been stolen, but also swears that all of his securities were taken from a safety deposit box of the father's death before the funeral arrangements were made.
