AARTIN'S WILL CONTESTED BY MRS. DONAHUE

Claimed Late Pioneer Could Not Write His Name and Was Unduly Influenced.

Mrs. Cassie Donahue, daughter of the late Peter G. Martin, this morning filed papers in the county court contesting the will of her father, a well known pioneer, who died October 9, and by his will bequeathed all his property to his daughter, Mrs. Delia Hall. The estate is valued at several thousand dollars. Mr. Martin left three other daughters, Mrs. Donahue, Mrs. Mary Keller and Mrs. Lizzie Hall. The will provides that nothing whatever is to be left them, not for lack of love for them, but in justice to Mrs. Hall, who cared for him during his last years. Mrs. Donahue avers that she and the other daughters who were not to share in their Donahue avers that she and the other daughters who were not to share in their father's estate had not been allowed to visit him unless Mrs. Delis Hall was in the room at the time, and that at the time the will was made, April 1, 1905, her father was not of sound mind and was easily influenced and controlled by Delia Hall and her daughter Amie. "In order to carry out her scheme to procure all the property of her father, the said Delia Hail by her acts and conduct and with the assistance of other parties, caused the aforesald instrument to be prepared and signed by some one as and for the last will and testament of said Peter G. Martin, and your petitioner avers that said Martin was at that time unable to sign his name at all, and said instrument was signed without his knowledge, or if signed with his knowledge, he was not of sound and disposing mind or memory."
