

Famous Californian Will Probably Spend Remainder of Days in Darkness.

UNDERGOING TREATMENT IN A 'FRISCO HOSPITAL

For More Than Half a Century Baldwin and Fate Have Been Playing a Game of Dice and His Luck May Now Triumph.

(Journal Special Service.)

San Francisco, Nov. 14.—On a couch in a darkened room at Lane hospital lies E. J. Baldwin, or "Lucky" Baldwin, as he is known throughout the length and breadth of the union. The aged man's struggie this time is not for gold, not even for life, but what is perhaps more precious, his eyesight.

The probabilities are that the remainder of "Lucky" Baldwin's life will be spent in total darkness. For more than half a century he and fate have been playing a game of dice. Often the game went against him, more frequently he won. But this time it seems he is to lose forever.

The decision of the commission is greeted with enthusiastic approval here Governor Mead wired his congratulations to the commission last night.
