

DRY SUNDAY FOR WALLA WALLA

Saloon-keepers Get Wholesome Lesson and Will Not Attempt to Defy Law.

END OF SALOON RULE IS IN SIGHT, SAY REFORMERS

Liquor Dealers Lose Over Two Thousand Dollars by Trying to Bulldoze City Council and Forfeiting Their Licenses.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Walla Walla, Wash., Nov. 25.—Walla Walla in all probability will be a dry town tomorrow.

The complete capitulation of the five saloonmen whose licenses were revoked by the council Tuesday night, reform leaders say, means the end of saloon rule in Walla Walla and that hereafter laws governing saloons will be fully obeyed.

As a result of the revoking of the licenses the five saloonkeepers forfeited \$2,045.54, representing the unearned portion of their licenses.
