STIFFER FEELING AMONG HOPS

Fully Fifty Thousand Bales Have Already Been Sold and Dealers Are Eager.

TURKEY MARKET HAS A SLIGHT WEAKNESS

Cold Snap Causes Better Demand for Millfeed—Export Flour Looks Like a Decline—All Fish Scarce Except Salmon.

Front Street, Nov. 28.—The principal features of the Portland wholesale markets today are: Hop market much stiffer. Wheat is dull but unchanged. Millfeed is quoted firmer. Millfeeds are quoted firmer. Pienke hams 14c off. Turkey market a trifle weak. Chickens moving again at price. Eggs are firm. All fish except salmon scarce. Potato market is picking up. Car sweets and car bananas. Temporarily scarce sweet potatoes.

Hop Crop of Oregon. Balances
Production 1905..... 50,000
Sold to date..... 50,000

Amount uncollected..... 45,000

To date fully 30,000 bales of this crop of hops have been sold in the market of Oregon. Out of this crop 50,000 bales there are 45,000 bales at present unsold. This is remarkable in view of the fact that crops all over the world the past year were record-breakers. Everywhere hops grew there has been an enormous surplus, but notwithstanding that the world's sales of hops are still as those in Washington have sold about half their product and there is at present a demand for every bale grown. No longer, however, are growers scared to death as to prices; they are not.
