

### COMPLETE CHANGE IN SENTIMENT IS SHOWN IN HOGS AND CATTLE AND PRICES ARE RULING WITH AN ADVANCE

#### Season Coming to an End and Trading During the Week is Very Light.

#### HOP MARKET LOWER AFTER DULL TRADE

#### China Buys Oregon Potatoes and Onions—Chickens in Better Call With Receipts Smaller—Movement in Apples is Heavy.

Higher, almost approximating \$1.05 a box, that the figures for the total production will be about the same—\$110,000.

The highest prices obtained by growers have been \$3 a box for Spitzbergs and \$2.50 for Newtons. This is the top notch price received for apples by the producer, and has been the rule for some time past. The average price for Spitzbergs at this price is about \$2.50 and for Newtons is \$2 flat. Apple orchards have not been so much in evidence as in previous years. This market has been mainly dependent on the prices for Hood River fruit, as it is in a class by itself and will continue to be so as long as fruit maintains its present standard of excellence.

There was a spirited rise in the cranberry market in this city during the week owing to a great rise in the eastern market.

Oranges and lemons are quoted down. Supplies considerably increased and prices at primary market much lower. Quality of fruit is but slightly inferior.

### POTATO SHIPPERS HAVE COMBINED TO FORCE THE GROWERS TO SACK THEIR STOCKS AS PER WRITTEN CONTRACTS.

#### General Firm Stand Taken Among the Producers—Not So Easily Fooled.

#### POUTRY TRADE TO QUICKEN OVER THE HOLIDAYS—No Dressed Turkeys Are Now Coming—Wheat Options Are Dull.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Independence, Or., Dec. 9.—The hop market has been quiet in this district the past week. The growers are now cutting their crop and the firm and resuming for another 90 days, which would indicate that they intend holding for better prices. One sale was made today. Alvin Craven sold his crop of 900 bushels to L. W. Craven for \$1.00 per bushel. Craven, for 1915 crops. This is the crop that Young & Dorcas claimed to have bought and threatened not to deliver. Craven claimed they had misrepresented the facts to him, as he said they would deliver the hops under the top price. The sale was made over the phone, but after coming to town and finding he had not been offered the top price Craven refused to deliver the hops. Craven & Young tried to prevent the sale by taking the hops, but Craven's representative, sampled and accepted the hops today. Craven & Young are agents for the sale of hops in this district. At the first of the season there was a number of large sales reported made, but when the time came for delivery the buyers refused to accept the hops, while in the mean time they had picked up a number of small lots on the strength of the large sales reported made at low prices. The growers are now cutting their crop and are not so easily thrown off their guard by the bear reports.
