

Union Avenue Lines Out of Commission Through Burning of Cable.

EAST SIDE RESIDENTS WALK OR MISS CHURCH

Temporary Connection With Oregon City Line Enables Service to Be Resumed in Afternoon-By Tonight Old Schedules Will Be in Effect.

The east side office of The Journal is in the store of J. M. C. Miller, 300 East Morrison street. Telephone East 275.

Because of the burning of a cable yesterday the majority of east side residents were compelled to walk to church. For half a day all the Union avenue lines were out of service and even today the Russell-Shaver line to Multnomah and Lower Albina is idle. The big cable that carries current for Vancouver, Woodlawn, Albina, Vernon and Broadway lines burned out at an early hour in the morning and the break was one that could be repaired only with a new cable. As soon as it was discovered how serious the accident was all effort to repair the cable was given up, and linemen started to rig out a up, and linemen started to rig out a temporary line from the power cable from Oregon City, making a connection near the Inman-Poulsen mill. The current was connected up through the Grand avenue wires to East Burnside street and Union avenue traffic was resumed shortly after noon, after a delay of five hours.

The cars crossing the steel bridge, being those on the St. Johns, Upper Albeing those on the St. Johns, Upper Albina, Irvington and Lower Albina lines, were not bothered by the break and to a certain extent supplied the service usually offered by Union avenue lines. Today a force of men has been busy repairing the break on the Burnside bridge and an entire new cable has been laid across the river. Unless something unexpected happens the usual service will be resumed this evening on all east side lines.

Such a general delay in traffic has not occured for months. Owing to the number of power cables to the east side number of power cables to the east sine and the opportunity to connect with the Oregon City main lines it is said to be practically impossible for the streetcars to be tied up for a considerable length of time across the river. The installation of the big power plant of the Oregon Water Power company at Cazadero and the bringing of this power to the city will give a further protection to the city will give a further protection that will make it almost imposible for serious delays to occur.

NEW TELEPHONE LINES.

Company Soon Will Begin Stringing Cables. Work for the installation of the automatic system of the Home Telephone & Telegraph company is well along on the east side. A line of poles has been set on Russell street and up Union avenue to Highland and the work of stringing the cable will begin soon. South of Russell street on Union avenue and through the Irvington and central east side district the company will lay conduits. Preparatory work for these mains has been completed and workmen will soon be in the field. The pole line on Russell street and Union avenue is the best work of the kind in the city. None of the poles is under 45 feet high and the lines of the telephone, streetcar and electric light companies are topped

and electric light companies are topped by 10 feet or more.

A single cable will be carried, the largest so far strung in the city. It will carry 1,000 wires instead of the 100 wires so far installed by the tele-100 wires so far installed by the tele-phone company. Should such a cable prove insufficient for the upper Union avenue district others will be added. By making the unit 1,000 wires the company is prepared to carry 5,000 wires on a single pole line more easily than 500 wires have been carried under the system at present in vogue in Portland.

MORE LIGHT WANTED.

St. Johns Has Two Street Lights for Three Hundred Blocks.

If a city has 2,500 people, most of whom object to carrying lanterns by night and the council of that city has six arc lights to place, how can the few lights be placed to the entire satisfaction of the community? St. Johns aldermen want to know. The two arc lights of ancient pattern that have done duty in the town have served their day and by close figuring the council has decided that six lights more can be afforded. There are in the town about 300 blocks of well built-up territory and every street corner has its several adherents. To adjust these claims and to put the few lights where the many can miss the most mud holes is the problem that has occupied most of one council and will probably occupy another or two before it is settled.

There is another way out and that Three Hundred Blocks.

There is another way out and that is to get the electric light company to is to get the electric light company to give the arcs at about cost so that more can be installed, but so far this solution has not impressed the corporation officers favorably, though urged by the councilmen. As the company has no franchise in the city, only a right to operate, it is distinctly under the control of the council and some settlement of the plan is probable.
