Residents on Raleigh Street Fighting Effort of Northern Pacific to Get Highway.

SAY PROPERTY SHOULD BE FOR PUBLIC TRAFFIC

Many Are Compelled to Use This Thoroughfare in Reaching Depot and Its Improvement Is Being Urged.

At the next meeting of the city council a petition will be presented by Couch Flanders asking for the vacation of Raleigh street from Twelfth throat street, a distance of nearly two blocks. It is said to be the desire of the petitioner to secure the vacation of the ground for the purpose of including it in the terminal yards of the Norther Pacific railway, which owns the adjacent property.

J. Couch Flanders appeared before the street committee of the city council yesterday and asked that the proceedings for the improvement of Raleigh street be held in absyance by the city council until after the vacation proceedings had been settled, because he said it would be useless to improve a portion of the street and charge the cost to the property owners if it was to be to the property owners if it was to b immediately vacated. The proceeding had been started and the committee immediately vacated. The proceedings had been started and the committee could not stop them. Mr. Flanders decided to present his petition for vacation at the next council meeting.

Residents on Raleigh street have been trying for months to have the thoroughfare improved. It is one of the main arteries leading to the depot and if the street is vacated where desired it is said that many property owners will

"We will never permit this street to be vacated if we can prevent it," said Davis today. "Fifteenth and Sixteenth streets are already closed and Raleigh street is now the only avenue by which many of the residents reach the

which many of the residents reach the depot.

"The charter also provides that whenever a street is vacated the ground reverts to the adjacent property. The property adjacent to the portion of Raleigh street belongs to the railway company, and the ground would revert to the company for nothing. This land is valuable. They could not purchase it in the open market for \$56,000, yet they desire it to be given them for nothing.
